

NOTICE OF RACE

Seldén SailJuice Spring Series 2021

Organising Authority: RestartSailing

Thursday 1st April 2021 – Monday 31st May 2021

1. Rules

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2. The Remote Racing Safety Procedures (published in a separate document) also apply.
- 1.3. Competitors are reminded of their responsibilities to follow all applicable COVID-19 related rules or guidance. Full details are included in the Remote Racing Safety Procedures.
- 1.4. All competitors must follow any applicable local rules or regulations.
- 1.5. In the event of a conflict between documents, the Sailing Instructions will prevail.

2. Sailing Instructions

- 2.1. The Sailing Instructions will be available online before the event.

3. Communication

- 3.1. The official notice board will be online at selden.sailracer.org.
- 3.2. [NP] While afloat, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4. Eligibility and Entry

- 4.1. The event is open to all boats. Boats without a valid PY number, IRC certificate, or other recognised handicap, should apply to the Organising Authority to be appointed one.
- 4.2. Entries can be made online: selden.sailracer.org.

5. Fees

- 5.1. Entry fees are £20. Payment must be made online.
- 5.2. Entry fees include use of a SailRacer GPS Tracker and postage and packaging of said tracker.

6. Crew Limitations – Not Applicable

8. Qualifying Series and Final Series – Not Applicable

9. Schedule & Format

- 9.1. Sailors will compete in at least one race to be sailed at any venue over the period of the event. Using information collected by the SailRacer GPS Trackers, and additional information provided by the club, results will be collated to create a national leaderboard. Full details will be provided in the Sailing Instructions.

12. Venue

- 12.1. Sailors may compete at any venue, subject to local regulations.

13. The Courses

- 13.1. Each venue may set a course most suitable to their area which meets the requirements to be set out in the Sailing Instructions. The SailRacer software will allow for regional differences.
- 13.2. Deliberate manipulation of the course layout to favour local sailors will be viewed as a breach of RRS 2.

14. Penalty System

- 14.1. The Post-Race Penalty, Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes procedures will apply (for information on the procedures, visit the RYA website). The outcome of an RYA Arbitration can be referred to a protest committee, but an arbitration cannot be reopened or appealed.



15. Scoring

- 15.1. A boat's series score will be the sum of her race scores.
- 15.2. Data from the SailRacer Trackers will be used to generate a finishing position for all boats based on their average lap time and adjusted for course size, wind speed and other local differences. Full details will be provided in the Sailing Instructions.
- 15.3. All data will be reviewed by the Race Committee and the finishing position they award to each boat will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

21. Data Protection

- 21.1. The personal information you provide to the organising authority will be used to facilitate your participation in the racing. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the racing (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the organising authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with the RYA, your national authority and/or World Sailing. The results of the racing and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.
- 21.2. By participating in the event, a competitor automatically grants to the Organising Authority and the sponsors the right in perpetuity to make, use and show at their discretion any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of him/her during racing, and of all of his/her material related to the championship, without compensation.
- 21.3. In order to manage the events, information provided by competitors will be held on a database. The management of personal information and images will comply with General Data Protection Regulations. More details are available on request.

22. Risk Statement

RRS 3 states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any briefing held for the event;

23. Insurance

- 23.1. [NP] Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3 million per incident or the equivalent.

24.1. Prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority.
