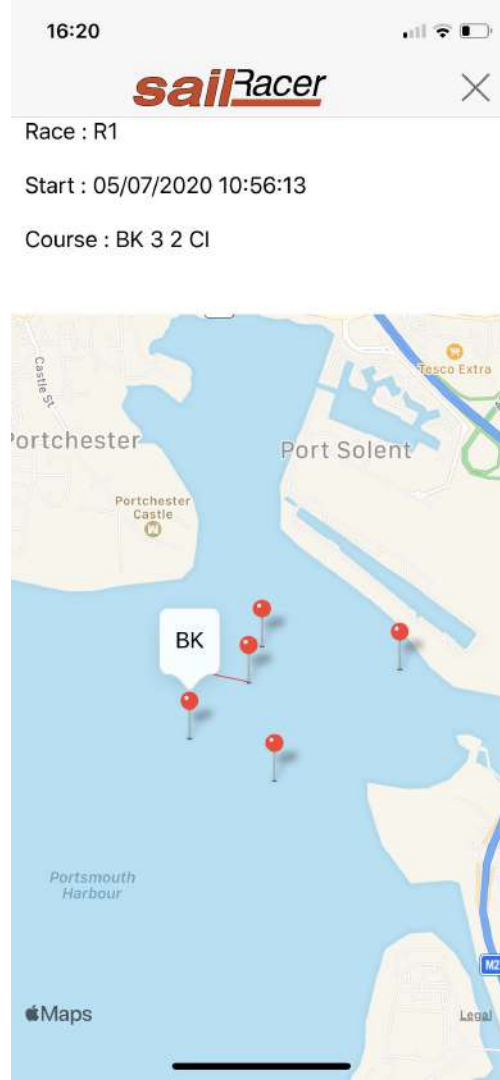

2. Our approach is considerate and conservative

Considerate: be mindful of the potential impact that you could have on other water users and do not place unnecessary extra strain on the RNLI and emergency services.

Conservative: help to minimise incident and accidents by taking an extra cautious approach to your boating.

Our guidance on safe boating remains unchanged: know your limits; look after yourself; keep in touch and, above all, have a plan. As the restrictions are relaxed, we advise boaters to think about these factors. The RNLI and the RYA have also worked in collaboration to produce [joint safety guidance](#) to help ensure that this summer is as safe as it can be.

1. Introduction
 - 1.1. The contents of this document are Rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing*.
 - 1.2. Competitors are reminded that the Race Committee reserve the right to protest any boat for breach of any of the Rules defined within this document. Breaches which the Race Committee feel threaten the safety of other competitors may also be viewed as a breach of RRS 2.
 - 1.3. This document should be read in conjunction with the NoR – particularly the Risk Statement in NoR 20.
 - 1.4. Competitors are reminded of RRS 4 – “The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone”. Nothing within this document lessens that responsibility.
2. COVID-19
 - 2.1. Competitors are reminded that they are required to follow all COVID-19 rules and guidelines from their Government, any local Government, their Member National Authority and their home club.
 - 2.2. In particular, competitors may not compete, and must remain at home, if they are displaying any symptoms of the disease.
 - 2.3. Competitors must maintain a social distance of at least 2m from anyone else in the same situation.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
Organising Authority: National Solo Club Racing Championships
Sunday 19th July 2020

- Rules**
 - 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
 - 1.2 The National Solo Class Rules also apply.
 - 1.3 The Remote Racing Safety Procedures (published in a separate document) also apply.
 - 1.4 Competitors are reminded of their responsibilities to follow all applicable COVID-19 related rules or guidance. Full details are included in the Remote Racing Safety Procedures.
 - 1.5 All competitors must follow any applicable local rules or regulations.
 - 1.6 In the event of a conflict between documents, the Sailing Instructions will prevail.
 - 1.7 In the event of a conflict between documents, the English version will prevail.
- Notice To Competitors**
 - 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the online noticeboard at sailracer.org.
- Changes To Sailing Instructions**
 - 3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted online no later than 2000 on Saturday 18th July 2020.
- Signals Made Ashore**
 - 4.1 There will be no signals made ashore.
 - 4.2 The Race Committee may communicate with competitors using electronic means.
 - 4.3 Adequate personal buoyancy shall be worn at all times by all competitors and support persons whilst afloat or on the foreshore near the water except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. This changes RRS 40. Flag Y will not be displayed. Wet or dry suits are not adequate personal buoyancy.
- Schedule & Format**
 - 5.1 Sailors may compete at any venue as long as applicable Government and local rules and guidelines allow. The venue may be either at a 'club' or any other piece of public water. The location sailors choose to sail at will henceforth be referred to as their 'venue'.
 - 5.2 Sailors will compete in two races at their venue on Sunday 19th July 2020. Using the SailRacer app, and additional information provided by the club, results will be collated to create a national leaderboard.
 - 5.3 The races shall be run using an 'average speed' format. A representative from each club will pre-determine a course configuration which meets the requirements of SI E. Sailors will start, sail a number of laps around this course, and then cross a remote finish line. The app will calculate the sailors average speed between starting and finishing.
 - 5.4 Instructions on using the app will be provided.
 - 5.5 A representative from each venue will be asked to submit supporting information to the Race Committee using the form in attachment E.
